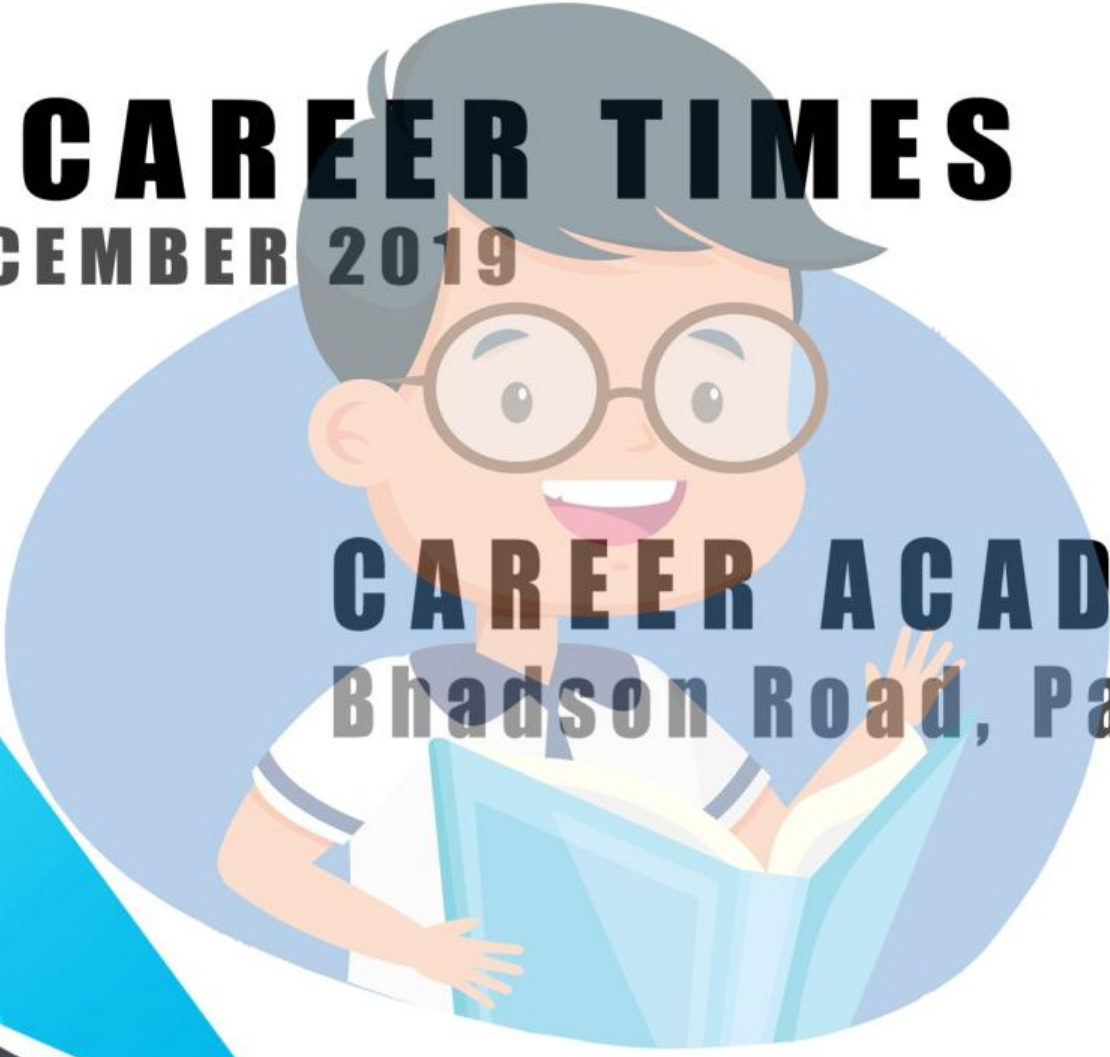

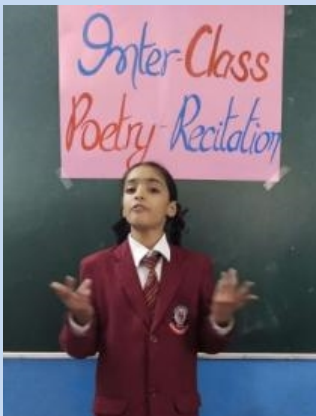

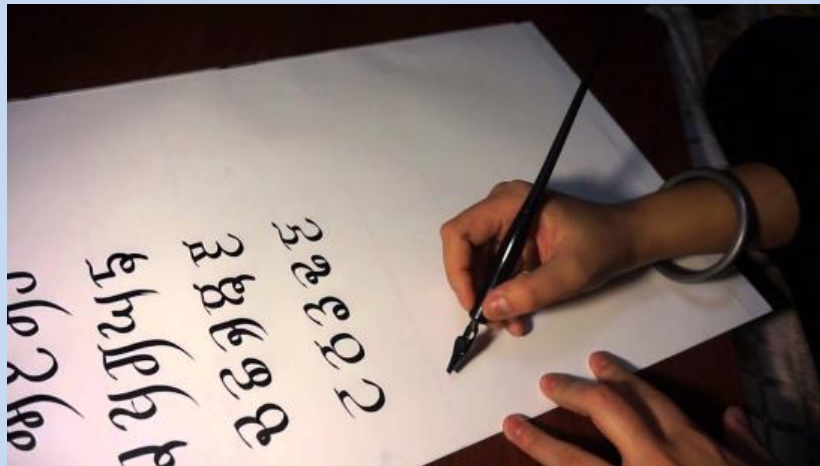
PUNJABI CALLIGRAPHY COMPETITION (DECEMBER 9, 2019)
